Course Description

This course is a 4 credit, laboratory course that is a continuation of BIO 131, Human Anatomy and Physiology I, with study of the normal and pathological structure and function of the human body. Emphasis will be placed on circulatory, lymphatic, respiratory, digestive, urinary, endocrine and reproductive systems. Dissection of preserved animal material is required. Prerequisite: BIO 131

COMPREHENSIVE FINAL EXAM-----Week of Dec. 15 - 22

Your grade in this course will be determined on a point system as follows:

10 best weekly quizzes X 20 points each ----- 200 points (20%)

5 unit tests X 120 points each----- 600 points (60%)

Final Exam----- 200 points (20%)

To determine points earned on unit tests, multiply the percentage score by 1.2

To determine points earned on final exam, multiply the percentage score by 2.

To determine points earned on weekly quizzes, multiply each by 2.

Extra credit will be assigned for two synopses. Successful completion of each will permit an addition of 10 extra points to the point totals. Resubmits will not be permitted so careful attention to the instructions for writing and submitting them is critical to earning the extra points.

A grade of "A" will be assigned for 930 - 1000 earned points.

A grade of "A- " will be assigned for 900 - 929 earned points.

A grade of "B+" will be assigned for 870-899 earned points.

A grade of "B" will be assigned for 830-869 earned points.

A grade of "B-" will be assigned for 800-829 earned points

A grade of "C+" will be assigned for 770-799 earned points

A grade of "C" will be assigned for 700-769 earned points.

A grade of "D" will be assigned for 600-699 earned points.

A grade of "F" will be assigned for < 600 earned points.

There will be **NO MAKE-UPS ON TESTS AND WEEKLY QUIZZES**, regardless of reason. A test may be taken early, provided ample time and appropriate reasons are provided, however, if a test is missed, the final will be counted an additional 12% at 32% of the final grade instead of 20%. If two or more tests are missed a "W" grade will be offered or a final grade of "F" will be assigned for the course grade. Exams and quizzes will consist of short answer type questions. One minute will be allotted for each question. Questions will test mastery of fact, application and critical thinking skills. Tests are my property and are not permitted out of the classroom. Mistakenly taking a test from the classroom will result in a grade of zero for that test and it will be calculated into your grade.

This is a laboratory course, requiring dissection of preserved material. Your **ACTIVE** participation is required in order to receive a grade. Absence from, or lack of participation in the laboratory, will warrant an incomplete grade until laboratory work is made up. Additionally, laboratory safety is of utmost importance. Protective safety glasses are available and should be worn when doing dissection. Please use them. Please understand that if you do not choose to use them, you accept the risk of injury. Additionally, scalpels are never to be used with any dissection, so please do not use them. In the hands of an unskilled user, they are extremely dangerous.

A "W" (Withdraw) grade will be given upon **personal** request which must be made **prior to the end of the last class**. **This means that YOU must personally deliver a completed withdraw form to me before the Unit V test is handed back.** Missing this deadline will result in the receipt of a grade in the course consistent with the grading policy stated above. **Ceasing your attendance in class is NOT a withdraw.** You must complete the required paperwork for a "W" grade. Ceasing attendance without the completion of the required withdraw form will result in a grade of "F." **A "W" will not be assigned if a student has not been in attendance for 3 or more weeks.**

An "AU" grade may be requested provided an appropriate audit form is completed and filed with me. An "AU" grade implies that you will not take tests and quizzes and will attend classes regularly. An "AU" grade will not be given if 3 or more absences occur, at which point the "AU" will be converted to a grade of "F" if a "W" form is not presented. A partial cut or absence will count as a whole cut or absence for auditing purposes.

Cheating of any form will warrant an immediate "FX" for the course grade and expulsion from the class. This applies to the cheater and the "cheatee". Hats are not to be worn during class time. Please refrain from wearing them.
