Week 5: Azar, Chapter 11, Hogue, Unit 6 (parts 1-2), and Pavlik, Units 22-23.

Week 6: Azar, Chapter 11, Hogue, Unit 6 (parts 3-4), and Pavlik, Units 24-25.

**COURSE OBJECTIVES:**

At The end of the course, students will be able to use modal auxiliaries, present perfect tense, question forms, count and non-count nouns, and articles in both writing and

speech. They will be able to plan and develop short paragraphs with a clear topic sentence, supporting details, and conclusion. They will continue to practice the sound, rhythm and syllable systems of English.
